

#### **JESUS OUR LIFEGIVER**

The Gospel of today (Luke 7:11-17) presents the story of a widow from Nain whose only son died. There was nothing she could do than to cry bitterly. The death of her son was the death of her voice in her community. It was the death of her only source of hope, strength and protection. The story of the Wicked Judge (Luke 18:1-5) shows that widows were vulnerable in ancient Jewish society as they could be targeted by wicked people. In the absence of their husbands, their sons became their hope for protection.

Jesus understood the helpless condition [of] this widow. Although it would make him ceremonially unclean, Jesus [was] moved to touch the coffin carrying the dead [man] and, He who is life and [the] source of life, restored him to life.

Right now maybe you are going through a very difficult time in life and actually doubting the presence of God and His love. Your marriage, career, business, [health]... your only source of strength may be dead. All you need is a touch of the Lifegiver. Nobody knew that He was visiting Nain that day... Psalm 46:1 says, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." [The people of Nain were astounded by the miracle wrought before their very eyes and responded], "God has visited His people." You will also be a witness to glorious things. God is still on the throne... May God revive us, restore us, and give us life through Christ, Our Lord Amen.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us. We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die - but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

number of the townspeople were with her. When the Lord saw her he felt sorry for her. 'Do not cry,' he said. Then he went up and put his hand on the bier and the bearers stood still, and he said, 'Young man, I tell you to get up'. And the dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him to his mother. Everyone was filled with awe and praised God saying, 'A great prophet has

appeared among us; God has visited his people'. And this opinion of him spread throughout Judaea and all over the countryside.
